

Project Overview: Access, Support and Coordination (ASC) Programme

The Access, Support and Coordination (ASC) Programme was a three-year initiative implemented in Trinidad and Tobago by the International Organization for Migration (IOM), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), and UNICEF. The programme aimed to enhance the protection and support services for survivors of human trafficking.

Objectives:

- Strengthen the capacities of governmental and community-based partners responsible for coordinating efforts to respond to the needs of trafficking survivors.
- Provide comprehensive and integrated, survivor-centered, specialized services and support through coordinated efforts by national protection actors and civil society organizations.
- Address crucial gaps in support services for trafficking survivors by bringing together international organizations, government ministries, and local partners
